PARKING: To better accommodate our livestock exhibitors, parking inside the fenced area will be limited to vehicles carrying livestock. Please contact the Superintendent to obtain a parking permit for your livestock vehicle. **This permit will admit the vehicle and driver only.**

WHO MAY ENTER: Junior Exhibitors must be between the ages of 7 and 19. Children under 7 years of age are only eligible to show in Toddler Showmanship and not in Breed Classes.

EXHIBIT DELIVERY: Animals must be on the grounds **by 6 pm Friday and ready to show by 9 am Saturday**, and remain until 5 pm Sunday. They must enter the South Gate to obtain access to the Junior Dairy Barn where bedding and water will be provided. On Saturday, the South gate will close for entry at 9 am and reopen at 8 pm for re-entry. On Sunday, the gate will close at 9 am and reopen at 5 pm.

EXHIBIT REMOVAL: See General Rules, Livestock Exhibitors.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Connecticut Requirements: All exhibitors are required to show to the Superintendent a **rabies vaccination certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian** indicating the name of the vaccine and serial number. Animals must have been vaccinated 30 days prior to the first show date. Exhibitors will be required to display to the Superintendent health certificates as required by the Connecticut Department of Agriculture. **No animals are to be unloaded until the Superintendent has seen these documents. Animals' ear tags must match certificates.**
2. Animals shall originate from herds that meet the testing and health requirements of the State of Connecticut. Recently imported animals must have met the health and testing requirements for entry into Connecticut. Proof of compliance with state requirements will be requested.
3. Out-of-state cattle are required to have current health certificates, test charts, and vaccination certificates (where applicable) and must comply with the health and testing regulations set forth by the Connecticut Department of Agriculture.
4. **Animals not complying with the above regulations will be removed from the fairgrounds. The Superintendent will check all exhibitors for their health charts which must be in compliance with all regulations.**
5. Certificates of registry, transfer papers, and lease papers of all animals must be brought to the Fair and presented to the Superintendent.
6. All cattle will be judged in ring and must be in ring when the class is called.
7. No animals will be accepted on arrival at the fairgrounds unless properly entered.
8. The Fair will provide two bales of bedding per animal for the weekend.
9. Show whites are **required** for all classes. No tank tops or cut-off shirts are allowed.
10. The Fitting Showmanship Contest is **mandatory** for all exhibitors in order to receive premiums. Exhibitors must show their own cattle in this class.
11. All participants will comply with the Fair's overnight policy as stated and have a signed overnight permission form.
12. No cross-bred cattle.
13. Leased animals are welcome to be entered into the show. A lease paper must be presented along with a registration paper. All health rules apply to leased animals. A lease paper must state the name of the person or farm leasing the animal, the date the animal was leased, the animal's birth date, and ID number. Lease paper must be signed by both the child leasing the animal and the owner of the animal.
14. Due to space limitations, the Superintendent has the right to limit herd size.
15. **Send in a copy of Certificate of Registry and health papers with Entry Blank.**

1. Toddler Showmanship: 6 years of age and under
2. Novice Showmanship: First-year showman
3. Junior Showmanship: 7 to 12 years of age
4. Intermediate Showmanship: 13 to 15 years of age
5. Senior Showmanship: 16 to 19 years of age
6. Overall Showmanship: The first place of Novice, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Showman shall compete.

24. Club Herd: Five females owned by four or more exhibitors of the same club
25. Herdsmanship: A trophy will be awarded to the best exhibit in the barn judged on cleanliness of animals and bedding, care of "tools" and show box, walkway, and general overall appearance and educational value of exhibit.
